For the January Vascular Medicine Journal Club, we will welcome several of our vascular medicine colleagues from Henry Ford Health System in Detroit, including Drs. Herb Aronow, Vikas Aggarwal, Olusegun Osinbowale, Syed Ahsan, and Gabriella VanAken, who will be discussing use of cardiopulmonary exercise testing following acute PE. Join us at 8:00 PM ET on Monday, January 27, 2025.

Registration is now open for the 2025 SVM Fellows/APP Course, to be held March 15-16 in Atlanta. Space is limited, so please encourage your colleagues and trainees to register before the January 7 deadline. This complimentary course (chaired by Dr. Daniella Kadian-Dodov) is designed for fellows-in-training and for nurse practitioners and physician assistants in the vascular field. It provides an excellent foundation in vascular medicine including the diagnosis and management of arterial, venous, and lymphatic disease. Learn more.

Update from the Alliance for Wound Care Stakeholders: <u>Statement on the Final CTP (skin substitutes) LCDs</u> The statement illustrates our shared "win" that the final policy now allows up to 8 CTP applications (with supporting documentation) within a treatment episode, but also flags the lack of clarity on how products currently on the non-covered list can submit new evidence to be considered for coverage and the need for ongoing advocacy on that front.
